






Mrs. Wanda Hughes Teacher of the Year



To PRINCETON HIGH our eyes looked up, Our hearts were filled joy, When first we stepped into these halls, A growing girl and boy.


And through the years our minds grew well, In knowledge, love, and truth, And from these halls we now emerge, Matured, but yet in youth.

PHS STUDENT COUNCIL








MASQUE AND GAVEL
