BELLAMY AWARD

Week of Bellamy activities culminates with award presentation ceremony

Formal announcement that Princeton High School was the recipient of the 36th annual Bellamy Flag Award for the state of West Virginia occurred during the spring of 1977, but the actual ceremony and contingent celebrations took place October 8-16. Designated as Bellamy Week, activities began with the arrival of guests and officials from seventeen different states and ended with a tour of Southern West Virginia for visitors and hosts. Daily guest registration, participation in classroom discussions, rap sessions, visits to other schools in Mercer County, receptions, morning coffees, banquets, and special assemblies preceded the climatic presentation of the award.

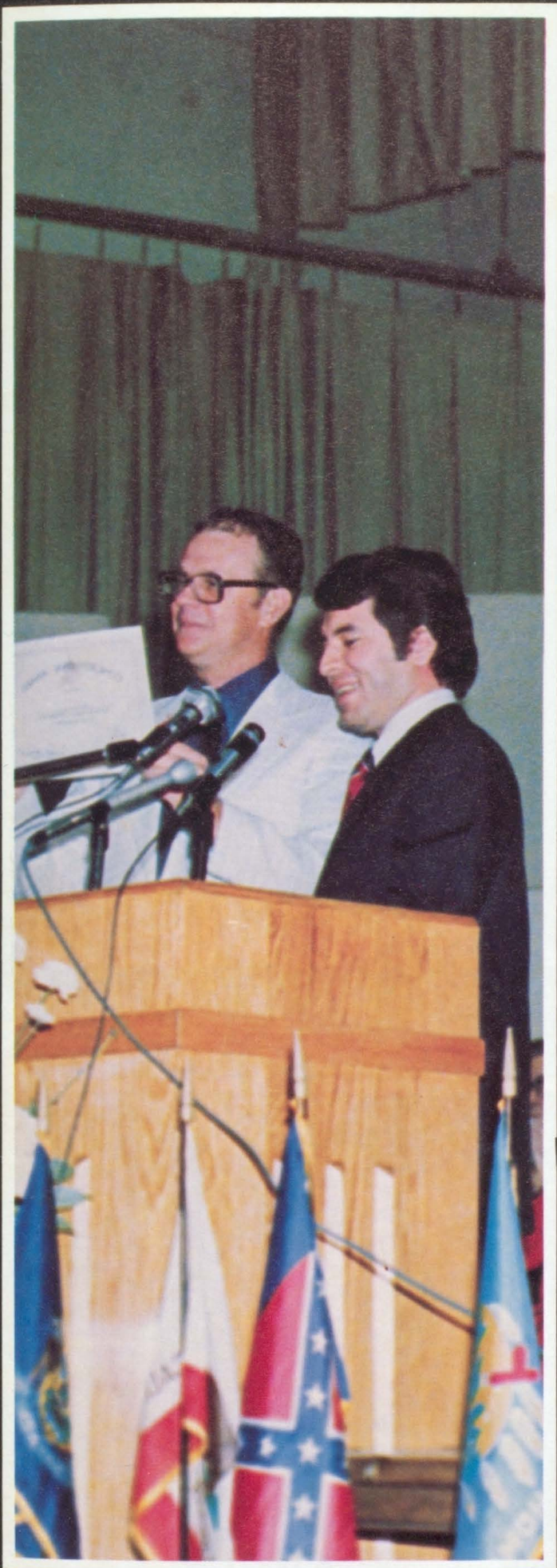
The actual presentation of the Bellamy Flag Award was made by Dr. Margarette Miller, Executive Director, after her introduction by Frank Di Berardino, Assistant Director of the National Bellamy Award. Acceptances were made for the student body by Sarah Shrewsbury, and for the alumni by Dr. Howard Six, assistant professor of Baylor College of Medicine, Houston, Texas. Principal Keatley expressed appreciation for the entire school and community and closed the ceremony with the announcement that "The flag that was flown over the United States Capitol on May 18 now flies over Princeton High School."

In retrospect, many students felt the upsurge of pride and renewed patriotism that Bellamy experiences engendered. Vickie Morgan stated: "Bellamy Week has been a week of learning about other people and other students and their states. Everyone will agree that Bellamy Week has been a week of learning. Dr. Miller has taught us new facts about the history of the Pledge of Allegiance and its author. Now is the time to look forward and grow." Bellamy Award Week was an added impetus that kept PHS going strong.

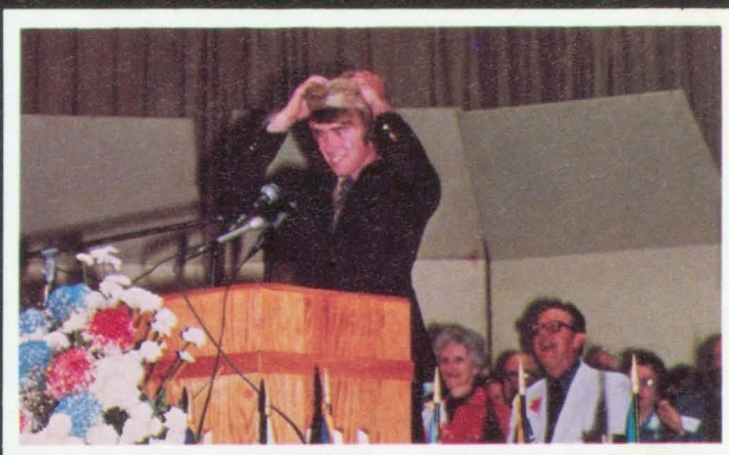

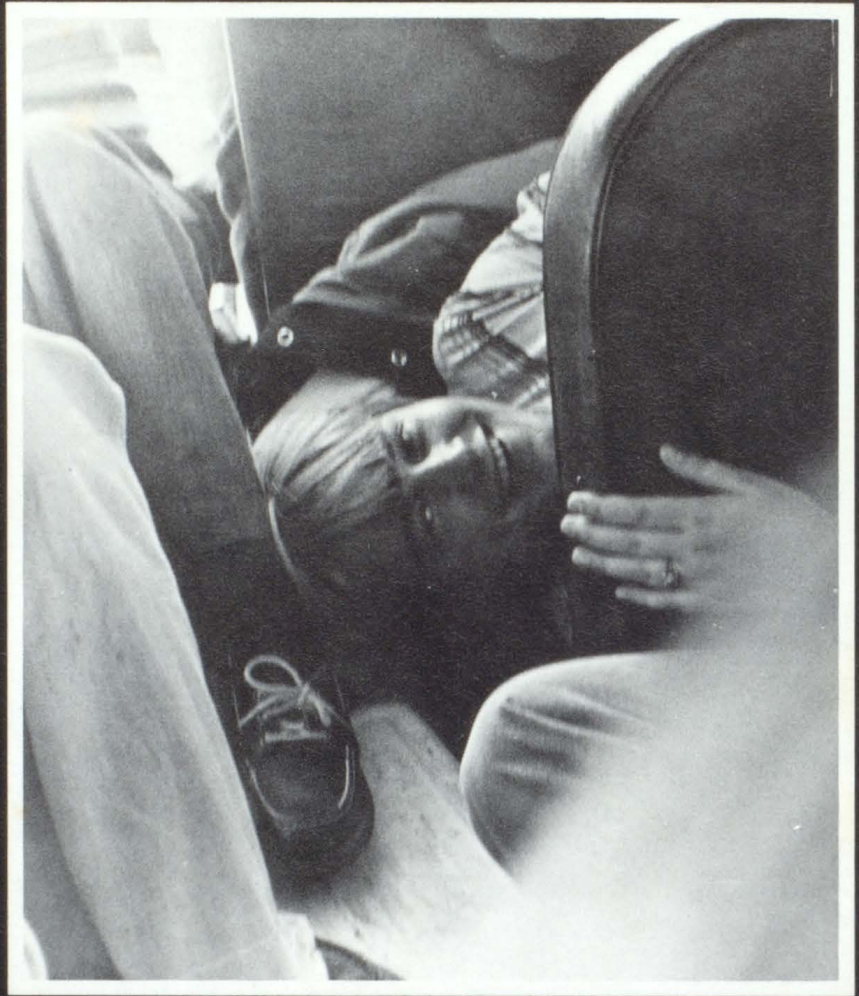

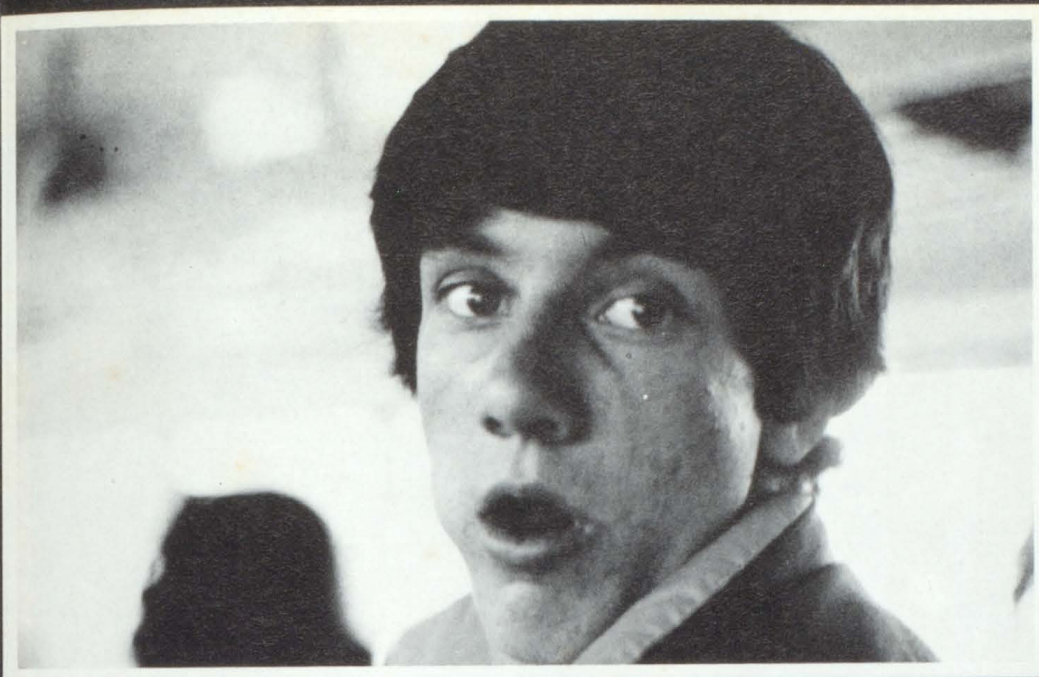

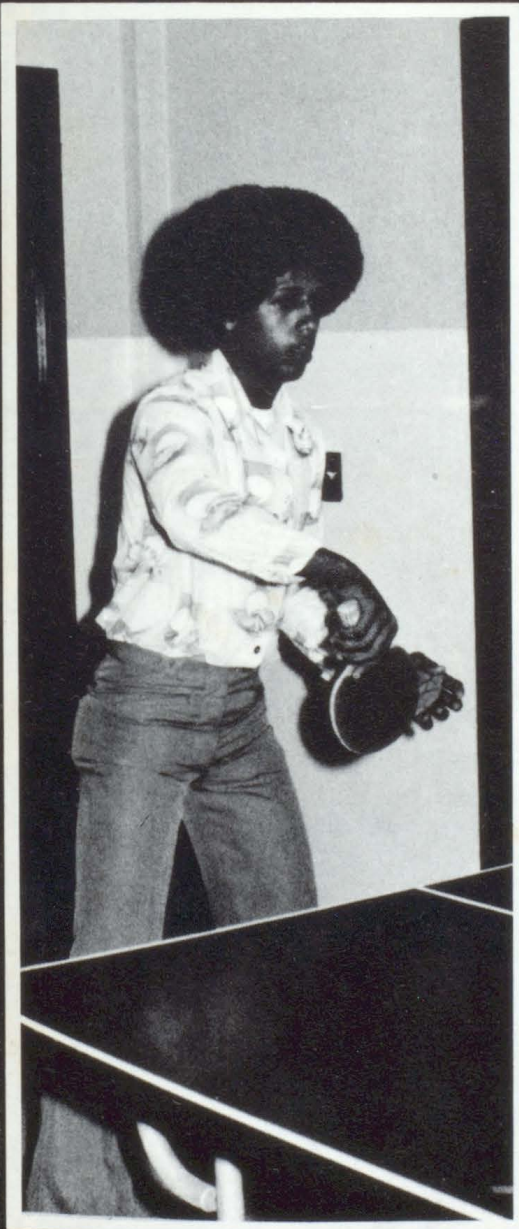

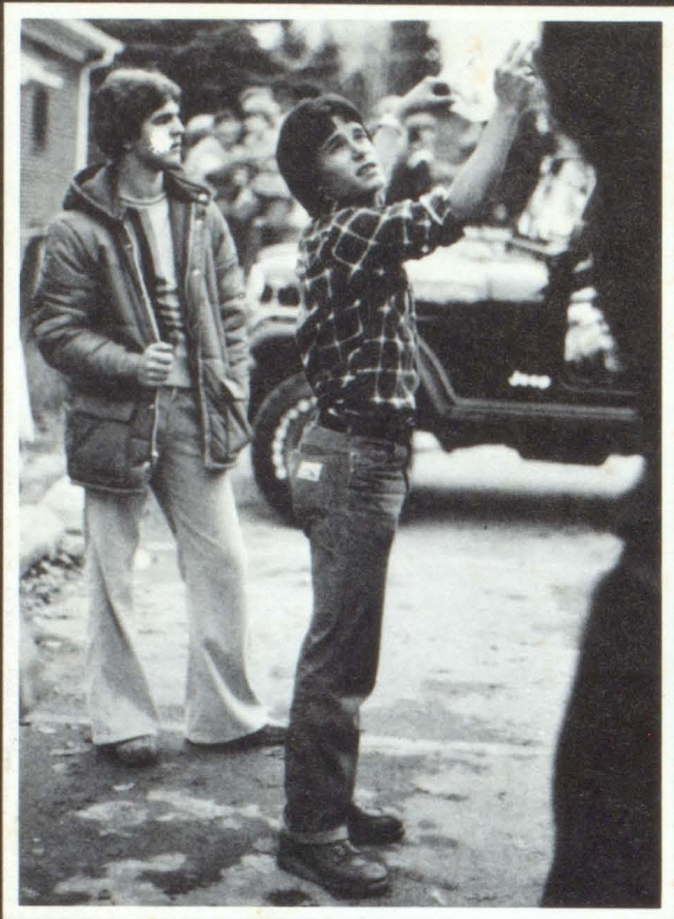

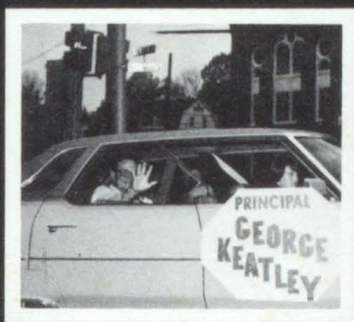

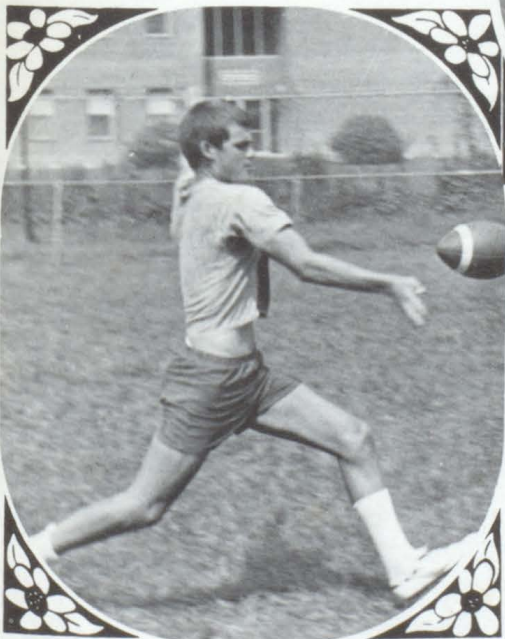

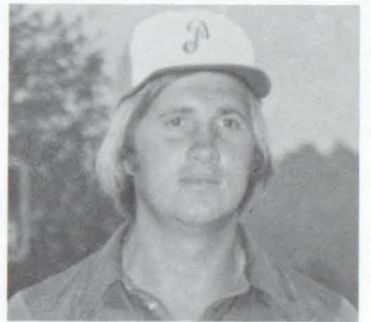

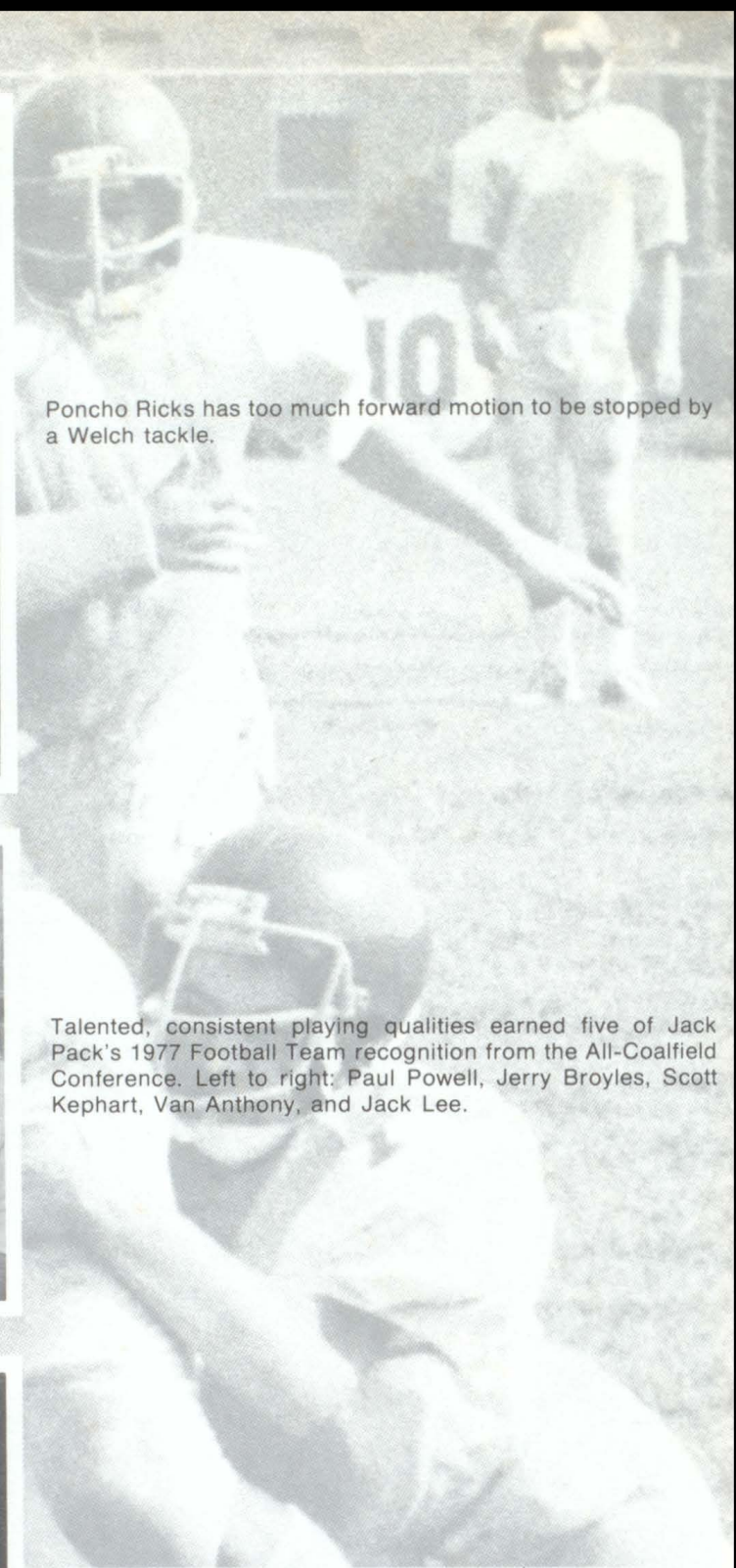

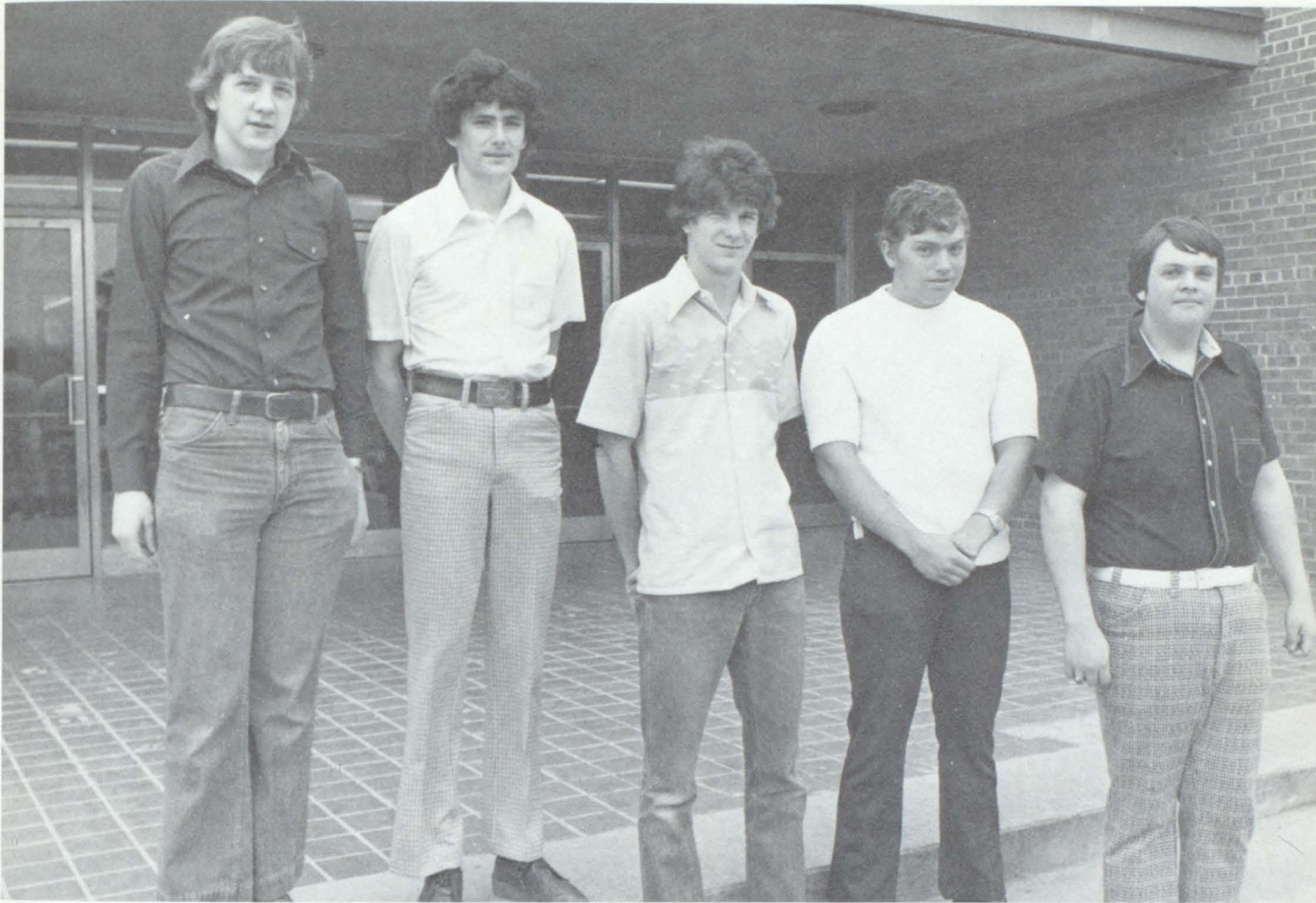

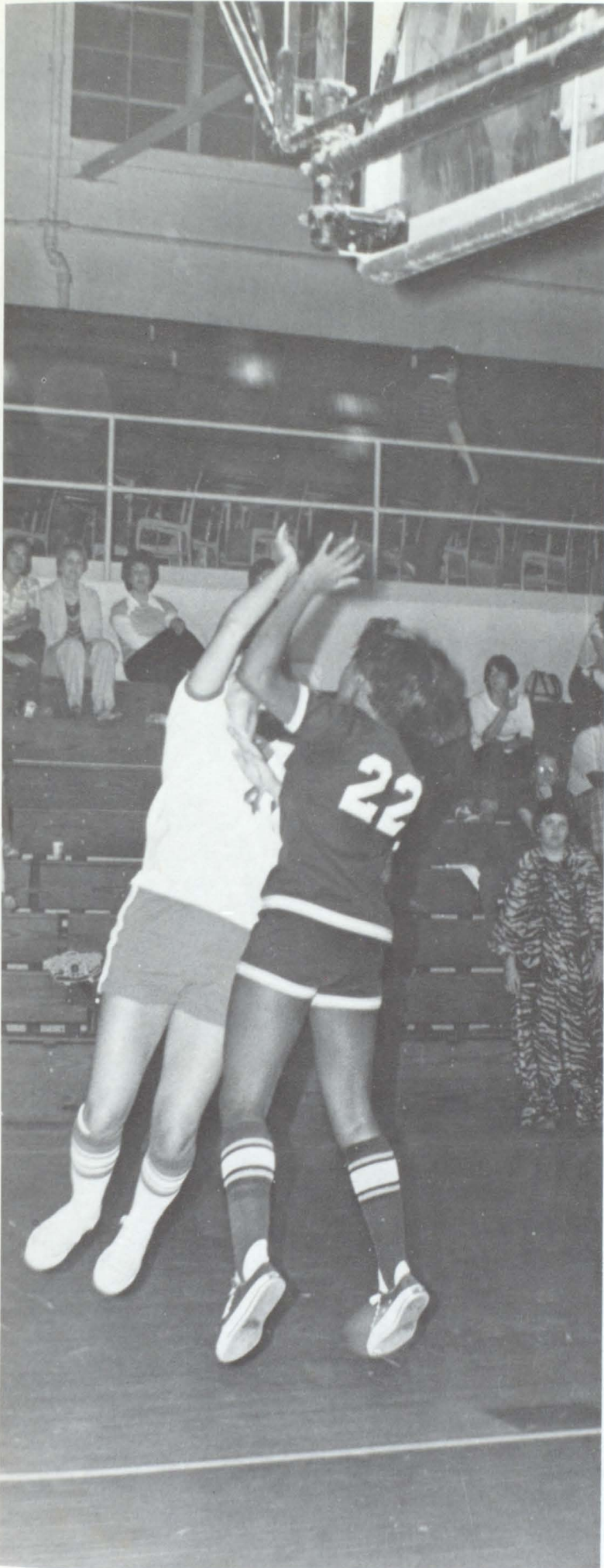

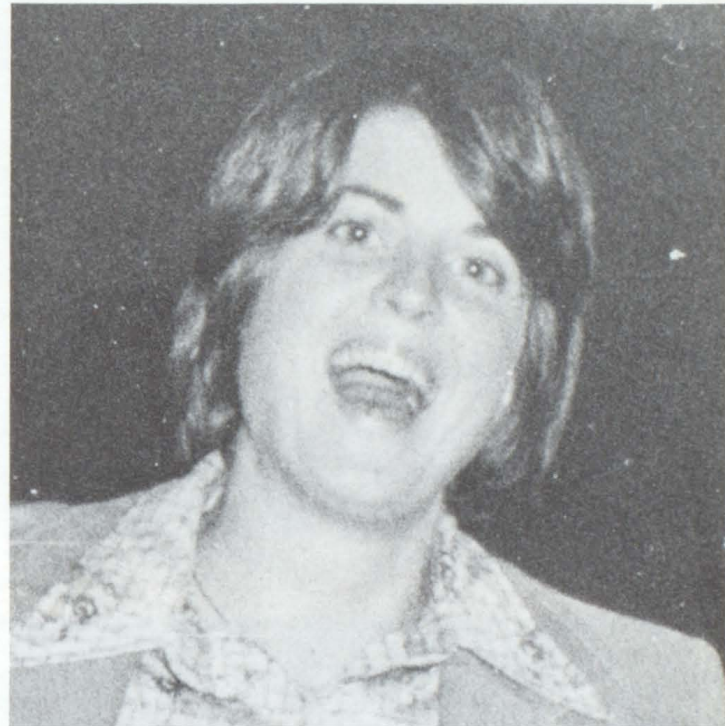

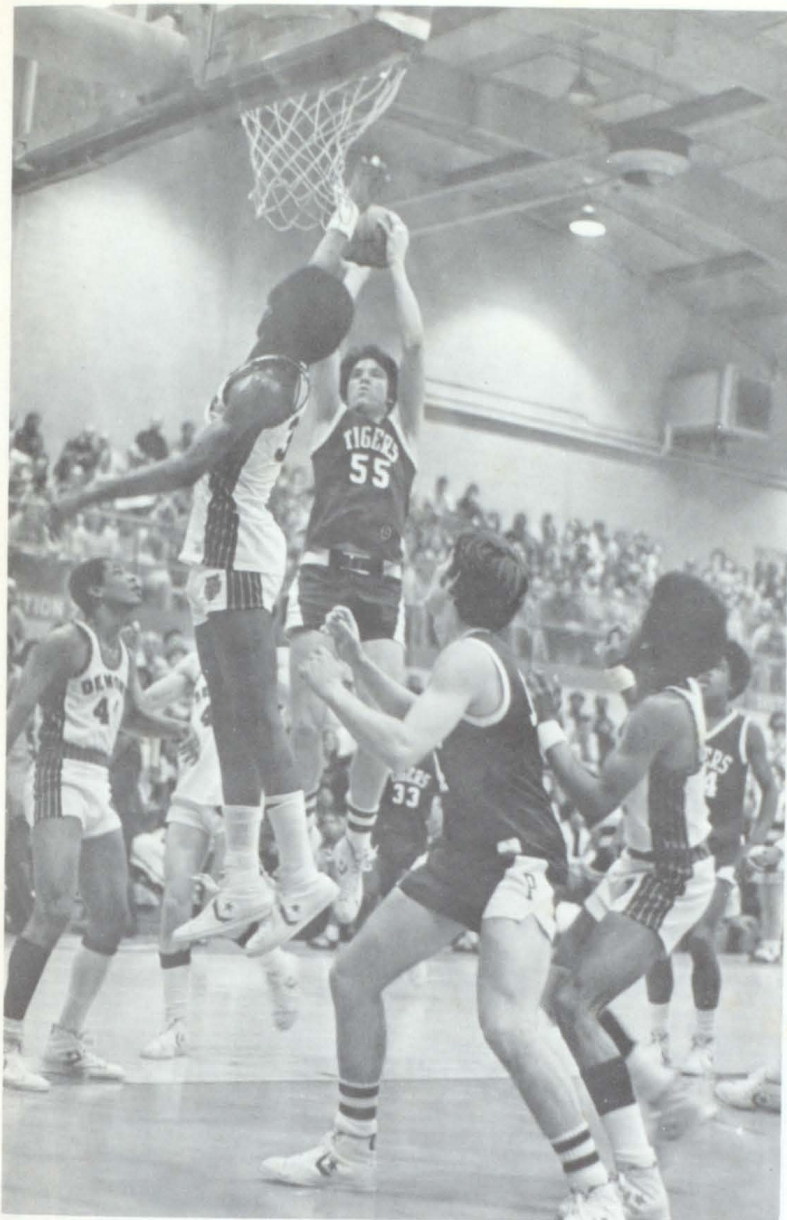

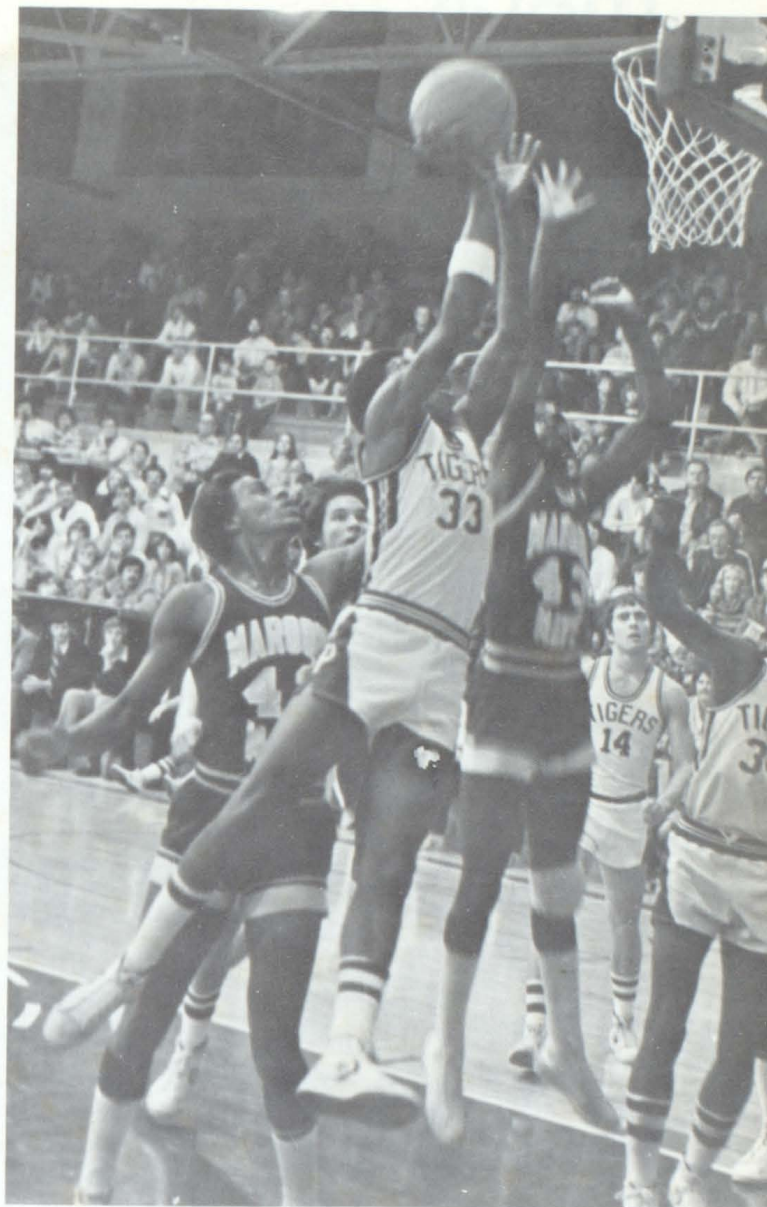

Winning the Daily Telegraph Relays was the most outstanding achievement for Jack Pack's track team this year. Overall, the Coach dubbed team performance "very successful." Individuals and relay teams qualified for the state track meet in Huntington May 26, 27. Those individuals qualifying were Harvey Goho, the mile; Greg Staton, the pole vault; Dale Rice, the discus, and Paul Powell, the shot. The results of the state track meet were both good and bad. Harvey Goho ran the mile in 4:35.9, breaking the Princeton High mile record set by Jim Via of 4:37 in 1977. However, this was only good for seventh place in the state finals. Mike Rachel, Jay Christian, and Mark Howard and Dale Hubbard ran the relay in 8:17.2, one of the fastest by any team in the state.

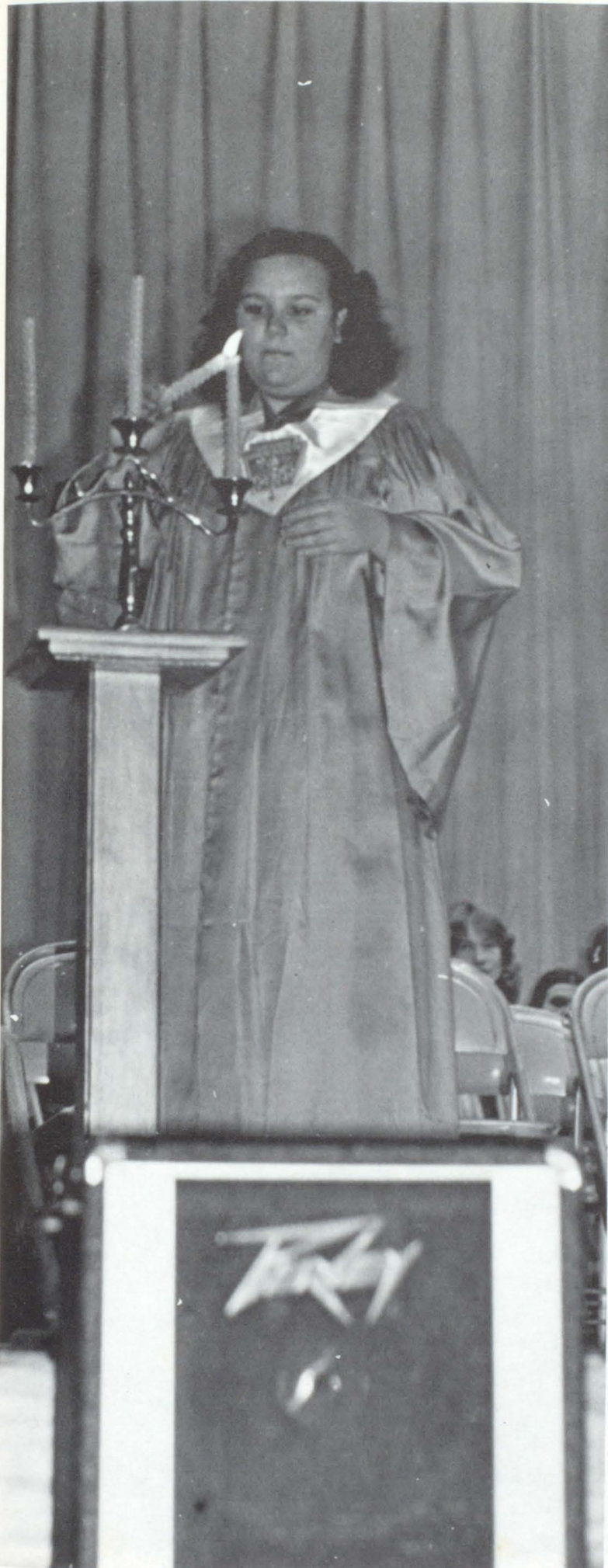

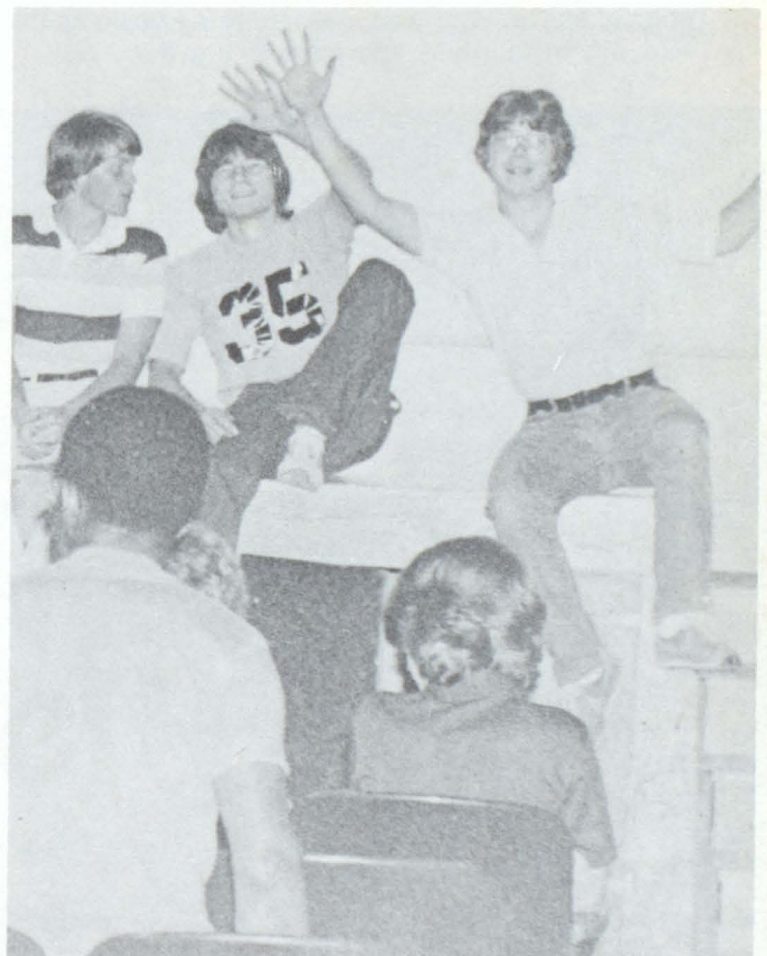

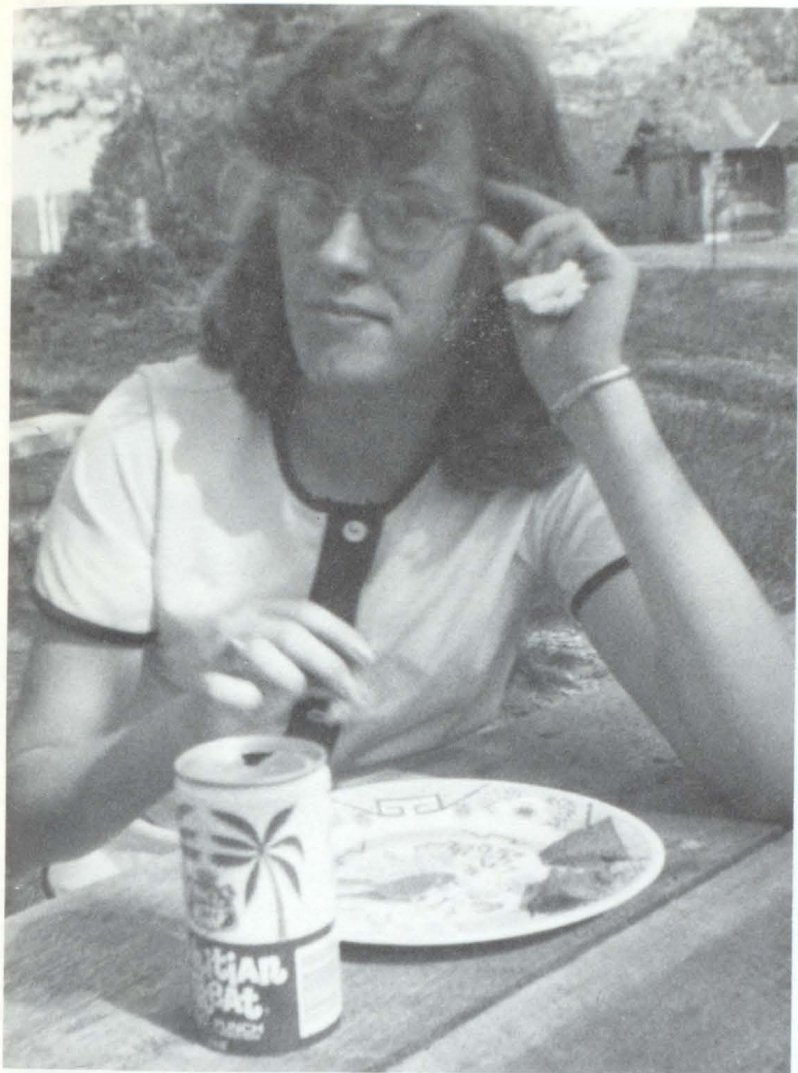

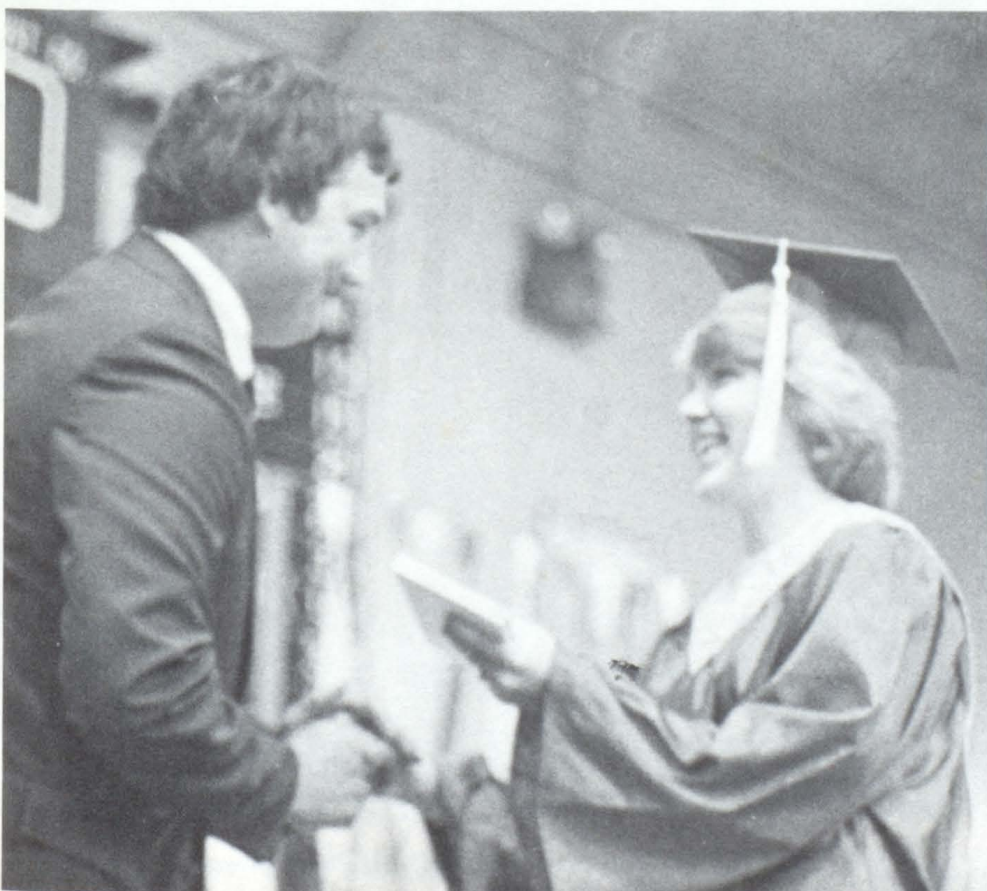

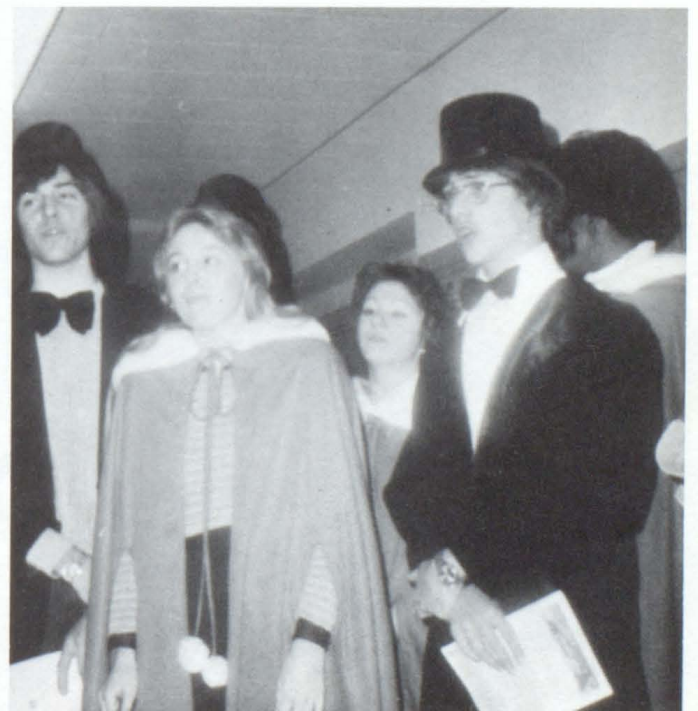

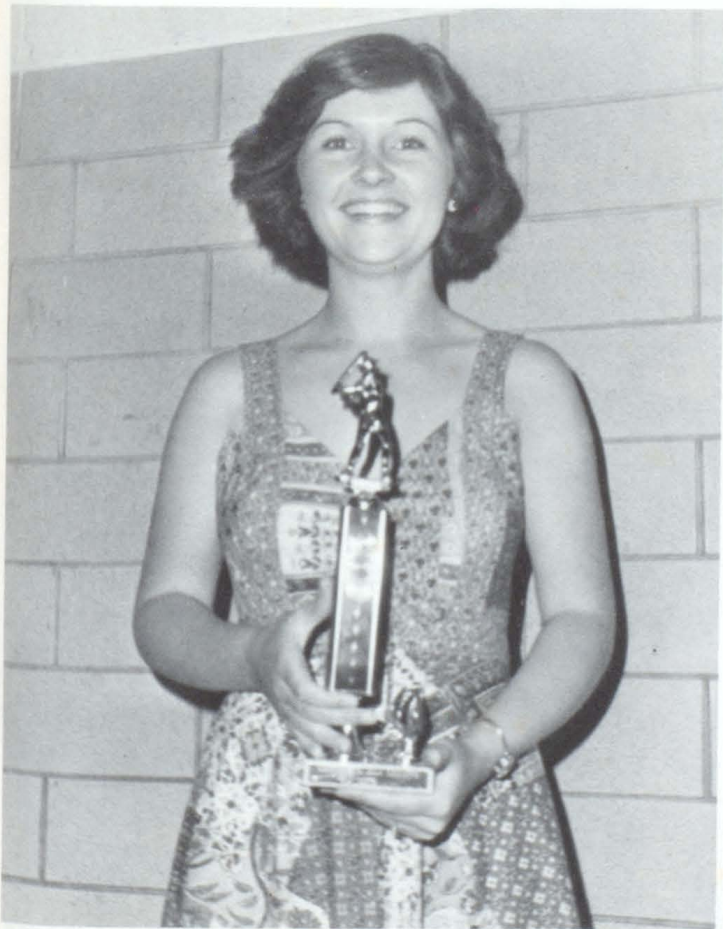

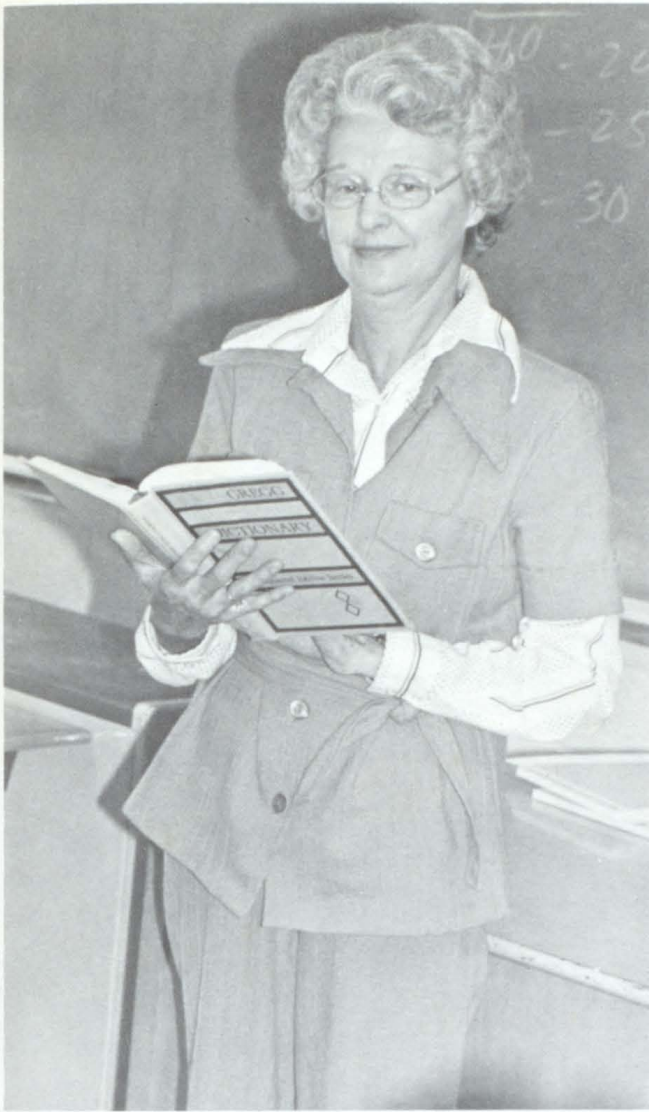

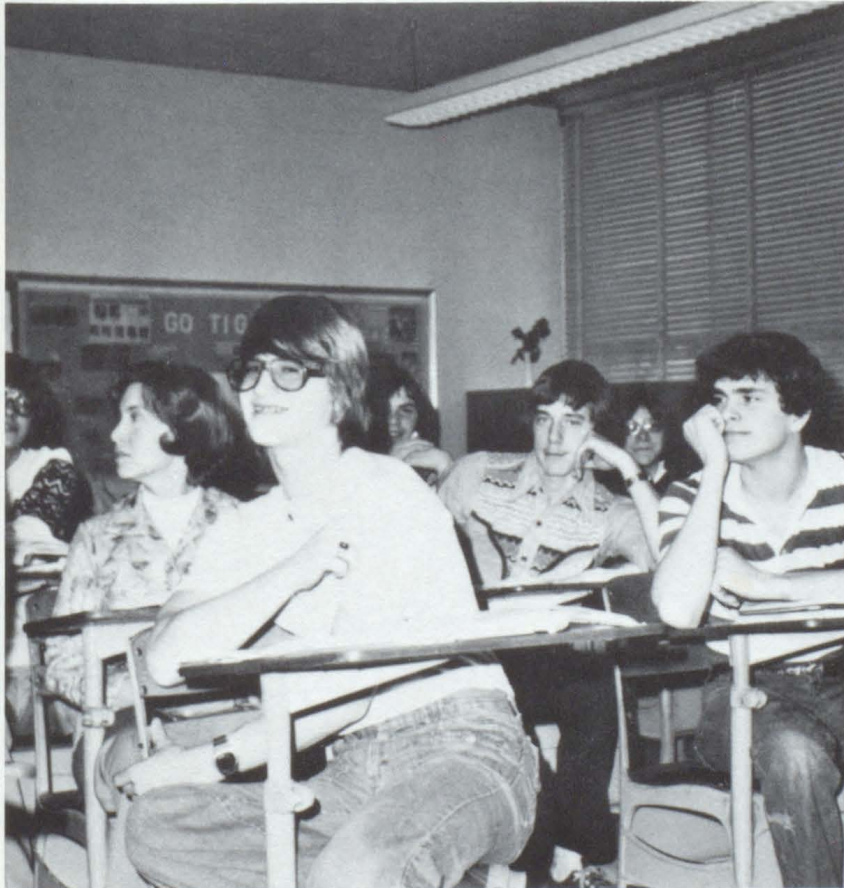
